1. VHF newsletters

In total, we published 9 newsletters between the 2 conferences. Five were published between the Conference in Varna and the interim meeting in Vienna 2016.

After this meeting we published 4 newsletters with the recommendations from this meeting, presenting a new VHF-Handbook and preparing the upcoming conference.

2. Actions taken after the Vienna Meeting 2016

See the “ToDo list” in attachment. Most of those topics will be addressed in this report. Two actions need to be started now:

- Letter Region 2 and 3 about APRS (if not done by RSGB)
- List of winners of the VHF contests to be published on the IARU website.

3. VHF- Handbook

Version 7.00

The new version of the VHF Managers Handbook, version 7.0, was published in January 2015. It contains all changes, decided during the IARU Region 1 conference in Varna 2014.

Version 7.51

All changes recommended during our meeting in Vienna 2016 were approved by the EC and integrated in this new version.

New VHF-Handbook

In Vienna 2016, there were 2 recommendations (25 and 02) to rewrite the VHF-Handbook.

The C5 chairman to review the VHF Managers Handbook and prepare a document for GC 2017 in accordance with all relevant Recommendations of VIE16_C5. The chairman will also prepare a new template/model of the handbook who will consider the actual matters without the loss of historical data.

Reading the former handbook was very confusing, because it was a collection of decisions and recommendations which had different kinds of interest, although they cover the same topic.

So, the new VHF-Handbook is separated in 4 different parts, depending on the interests of a reader:

- **General information:** for the average user of our bands who needs information about band planning, operating procedures and contest rules.
- **Technical references** about frequencies, hard and software,
- **The VHF-Managers**, committees or all interested in the IARU-Region 1 matters
- **Historical data:** a kind of archive to keep track about the history of all the work done by the IARU-Region 1 VHF & up committee.

There are no changes of the content in the current handbook, only the information is arranged in different way.

The rearrangement of the handbook shows, that it is a collection of different, discontinuous documents. This makes it very difficult to read and to understand. This made it clear that we need to define the purpose of our handbook.

I know that this is a new point of view that will need another approach about writing “guidelines” and procedures.

In the first place, we are doing all this work for our “basic customers”: the radio amateur himself! So, we need to change the title: no more VHF managers handbook, but VHF handbook.

In my opinion the VHF-Handbook should be a general guideline, with the most common sense. The rest can be “regulated” by the national societies if they want and if there is nothing else, this handbook is the guide line.

The task of the VHF-Manager is to translate the most suitable parts of the general rules into “national adaptations”, in line with IARU (Region 1) if possible.

So, we will have at least a main discussions for our upcoming conference:

- What is the purpose of our IARU-Region 1 VHF Handbook?

This will be formalised in a proposal for the upcoming interim meeting.

IMPORTANT:

The current version of the handbook (version 7.51) is still the only reference for the upcoming conference in Landshut.

4. WRC's

WRC 2015 was held in November 2015 in Geneva. This conference resulted in a new Band on HF (5 351.5 - 5 366.5 kHz).

However, another important issue is that a WRC decides on the agenda items for the next conference (which will be WRC-19).

For this latter matter, Region 1 currently has proposals in CEPT concerning potential WRC-19 agenda items for VHF/UHF/ μ Wave:

- 50 MHz: Allocating 50 - 52 MHz in Region 1 to harmonise with Region 2/3 (including adding an amateur satellite service allocation)
- 3,4 GHz: Harmonisation of amateur microwave bands – with a current focus on a Region-1 allocation of 3 400 - 3 410 MHz to align with Region 2/3

We succeeded to include the 50 MHz agenda item for WRC 19. Unfortunately, we did not get enough support for the 34 GHz item.

There is a lot of pressure on our microwave bands, for commercial usage, especially in the 2,3 GHz band and some parts of 1,2 GHz (Galileo). We need to be prepared to defend our bands and/or find some alternatives if there are changes A task for the next IARU-Region 1 conference in 2017.

The C5 committee is also involved in the work for WRC 2019 to get an harmonized 50 - 54 MHz allocation in all 3 Regions.

We also need to have attention for upcoming agenda items because many countries and the EU are searching for new frequency allocations between 450 MHz and 40 GHz (5G, IoT, car systems,...)

5. Beacons

Our beacon coordinator wants to stop his activities, we need to find a new coordinator. I want to thank Iain, GORDI, for his work in the last years.

6. Contests

Important changes

During the last conference in Varna the chapter about the IARU Region 1 contests were completely re-written, mainly:

- **Addition of the 70 MHz band:** during the June contest 50 and 70 MHz bands in separate sections.
- **Addition of an extra section for MGM:** in the 50 MHz and 70 MHz bands you can also use Machine Generated Modes (there are separate sections with and without MGM)
- **Addition of a 6-hour section:** in the 144 and 435 MHz bands, there is the possibility to score over a shorter 6-hour period, instead of just the full 24 hours (single and multi).
- **ATV contest rules were completely rewritten and the date moved to June.**

The main objective was to improve the participation rate of our contests; a little overview for the last 3 years

Martin, DL5NAH, who coordinated the work on the contest robot suddenly quit this function.

7. Prizing Ceremony

During our meeting in Vienna 2016 we decided that the prizing ceremony would take place during Friedrichshafen event. DARC was so kind to program this for the first time in 2017. There will be an award for the winners.
